Building on the success of the three previous symposia on CLIL, TESOL Italy Val d'Adige is pleased to announce the fourth symposium on “CLIL in the Adige Valley”, with a focus on the theme **implementation and challenges**.

Presenters are invited to submit proposals for

- 30 minute talks, and
- one-hour workshops

on any topic related to the theme of implementing CLIL in primary, lower secondary, upper secondary and tertiary education, and the challenges this can bring. The following is a non-exhaustive list of potential topic areas:

- developing curricula for CLIL and modifying existing curricula to meet the specific demands of CLIL
- the role of the content teacher and language specialist
- applying and adapting theory in the CLIL classroom
- identifying and overcoming problems relating to the implementation of CLIL
- assessment in CLIL
