TESOL-Ukraine Teacher Development Institutes 2022: How to Teach Post Millenials

ABSTRACT:

TESOL-Ukraine has been conducting Teacher Development Institutes since 2018 – every year we discuss and chose a topic of interest for English teachers, have trainings on it and then participants disseminate the results in their local teaching communities. In this webinar Olena Lienko will inform about the history of Teacher Development Institutes in TESOL-Ukraine, Liliia Kuznetsova will introduce the topic of 2022 “How to Teach Post Millenials” and Maryna Tsehelska will share the results of the first institute that was to be completed on Ferbruary, 24, the first day of the war, but its participants got a chance to present their projects only two months after.
